



> On July 4, 1882 the citizens of Sherman dedicated a Civil War  
> Monument which bears the names of thirty-five men who gave their all,  
> and all but two of them enlisted from this town."



**D.O.T. Response - Debbie received a letter D.O.T. stating that they would like to have a meeting to discuss the signs before they give permission to place them. Tim will be our tech support! He will be setting up the meeting and have it at the town office as soon as it can be arranged.**

**Bills - Jason submitted a bill for cemetery work in the amount of \$407.00. We are not sure whether this is for what he has done so far or the total amount which includes putting back the bases this spring. Harold will call him to see what the amount includes.**

**Grants - Debbie and Jeff have resubmitted the Stephen King Foundation grant. Although we did not receive it last year we were told that we could try again this year.**

**Painting of Cannons - Harold brought in quotes from Sherwin/Williams for primer and the over coat paint with specifications. It was agreed that 1 gallon of each would be needed. Tim said he had used this type of paint before and wasn't happy with it. We are going to investigate further to see if we can find something more durable.**

**It was suggested we get a few paint chips to have analyzed to see what kind of paint was used originally. Tim is going to contact Brewer Public Works to see what was used on the cannons they have in their cemetery.**

**Walkway - We discussed plans for a walkway to the monument and cannons to make it more accessible. We decided on a three foot paved path with crushed rock of some kind around the monument. A plan will be drawn up when we can get back in the cemetery to measure and see how much work has to be done. At that time, we will get estimates to have all or some of the work done.**

Canons and Bases = We had an informal meeting at the cemetery with Jason to have him explain just how he was going to put the bases back to support the cannons. He told us we have to do some prep work where the bases will set. We need to square up the base holes and make the surface level by using septic stone. We may need extra soil to tuck around the bases once they are set in. Lowell was to check with Bob Cummings about the back hoe. Harold and Tim are to check on gravel/rock. He also explained that he had to wait until the weight ban on the roads are lifted for him to bring the bases over. The pillars are 3'x 3' x 4' high and weigh about 2 ton each. It was also decided to remove the cannon ball holder which sat between the bases while Jason had his lift in the area.
