United States Colored Troops Monument

First Baptist Church, 211 Hyde Park St. Hertford, NC.





United States Colored Troops, Perquimans County. Located on Academy Green near one of Hertford's oldest black churches, this **monument**, funded by the **United Daughters of Veterans**—likely a group of African American church women—honors African American volunteers who fought for the Union army and navy. Few details are known about this obelisk, believed to have been erected about **1910**. The crossed flags are the Stars and Stripes and a Navy banner. Two monuments honoring Colored Troops—the official designation of African American soldiers—were erected across the **states** of the former Confederacy prior to the late twentieth century. The other, in Norfolk, Virginia, was begun in 1906 but not completed until 1920, making this Hertford commemoration the oldest completed memorial to African American troops in the South.
