



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

Fighters of Every American War to Be Represented When Monument Is Unveiled Friday

Veterans of the civil, Spanish-American and world wars and representatives of veterans of the revolutionary and Mexican wars and the war of 1812 will be present when the first soldiers' and sailors' monument erected in Oklahoma is unveiled next Friday afternoon at 3 o'clock at Fairlawn cemetery. Oklahoma City civil war veterans have been collecting funds for this monument for two years.

Professor J. B. Thoburn, speaking for the "Sons of the American Revolution," will tell what the pioneer army of the eighteenth century did for Uncle Sam. A. W. C. Weeks will outline the service rendered by the Grand Army of the Republic, and Major Charles Harrison will represent the Spanish and American Expeditionary

veterans. The women's relief corps will furnish patriotic music.

This is the only monument in the United States erected for every soldier, sailor and marine who ever fought for the United States, according to P. D. Kenyon, chairman of the committee in charge of the movement.

It is composed of a Mount Erie granite shaft, twenty-five feet high, resting on a seven-foot-square base. This is mounted on a mound several feet above the surrounding surface on four nicely located lots donated by the cemetery. The shaft is crowned with a bronze American eagle weighing 500 pounds. The wings' spread is five feet and one inch. The cost of the monument is \$4,000.

Monument Dedicated Today Represents Three Years' Work

With the unveiling and dedication of the soldiers and sailors monument at Fairlawn Cemetery today and labor of three years duration in which grand Army men have worked ceaselessly to bring about the fulfillment of their dreams for a monument to (unreadable), will be completed. It was on June 1, 1916 when Capt. P. D. Kenyon offered a resolution at a meeting of Grant Post Number 1 grand army of the Republic which dealt with the erection of a monument in Fairlawn Cemetery, the result of which is the present monument.

Appealed to public

At that time a committee of five from post one the same number from Oklahoma City post number 17 composed of P. D. Kenyon as chairman, J. C. White, treasurer, L. Obreiter, secretary, F. M. Riley. U. W. Barnard, A. C. Sims, C. T. Little, Wayne O'Donnell, O. C. Durland, and I. Cutright was appointed. This committee decided to appeal to the public funds for the monument.

Public schools were visited by this committee and all classes were addressed, resulting in a fund of \$269.72 being raised from contributions of the school children

On March 16, 1918 the committee was reduced to five members by unanimous consent the remaining members being Capt. Kenyon, J. C. White, F. M. Riley, U. W. Barnard, and L. Obreiter.

To this committee was deeded by the Fairlawn Cemetery Association lots 140, 141, 142, and 143 block 13, in the cemetery to be used as the site of a monument to cost at least \$3,000. On April 6, 1918, the committee contracted with C. L. West of the Oklahoma City granite and marble works for the erection of the present monument.

Papers In Box

The monument has a solid concrete foundation, 6 feet in depth, in the center of which is deposited a copper box, containing the role of contributors names, a copy of the contract, a Constitution of Oklahoma, an auditor's report Oklahoma City, and copies of newspapers of this city along with much other data.

The cannon and 120 shells were procured from the government by Secretary Obreiter through the influence of J. B. Thompson, congressman, and D. R. Shear, ex-Mayor. Judges George W. Clark, J. D. Phelps, E. D. Oldfield of the district court, and W. R. Taylor county judge. Fred E. Suits, president of the Cemetery Association was also an aid in securing the cannon.

The canons are twelve pounders that saw action in the Civil War, one having the date 1862 engraved at its mouth. The other is a Napoleon gun. Both were shipped here from the United States arsenal at Rock Island, Illinois.

Much Donated

All granite used in the monument was shipped here from Mt. Airy, N. C., and is 25 feet high. The tablets and the eagle are cast of standard bronze. The plans were drawn by member of the committee, and West charged no fee for the construction. In fact, he is said to have suffered a direct loss of \$149.50 other than his time and labor.

Large sums were provided for the monument by the two posts of the Grand Army, by the women's auxiliaries, by the Daughters of the American Revolution, the Sons of the Revolution, the Spanish War Veterans, and by many persons who are not connected with these organizations. Despite these contributions a deficit of \$58.99 was just pay just give a members of the Grand Army. It being their belief that the monument should not be dedicated today without every cent being paid. The total cost was \$3,575.15.

Symbolic of freedom and universality are the eagle and globe which crown the monument, and the four granite pedestals which now bear shells, are to be used for the reception of life-sized bronze figures representing the different arms of service.


Enclosed are completed Assessment Forms pertaining to the Soldiers and Sailors Monument in Oklahoma City, OK.

For a bit of history, this monument was originally proposed by the GAR post in Oklahoma City, with the idea that it would serve as a memorial to Union soldiers in the Civil War. As the idea progressed, the monument was then to be established as a memorial to all who fought in previous wars for the Union (including the Revolutionary War, Spanish-American War and WW I), along with the Civil War. You may note that one of the plaques on the monument refers specifically to 1861-1865. That plaque also lists the words, "Fraternity Charity Loyalty".

Following the initial modifications, the monument has continued to be referred to as either "The GAR Monument" or "The Soldiers and Sailors Monument". Because of the connection to the GAR, the Jeremiah Smith Camp No.1, SUVCW holds an annual ceremony at the monument on the Saturday nearest Remembrance Day. This year, that ceremony will be held on November 16. Members of The Daughters of the Union Veterans of the Civil War also participate each year.
