Laurel Grove Cemetery is located in unincorporated Glenwood along the Willamette River between Eugene and Springfield. The monument was placed in the cemetery in 1921. We have no pictures of the original monument configuration but have been informed that the sculpture on the concrete base was that of an eagle. Victory eagles were very popular on GAR monuments of that era. In any case the sculpture was vandalized over the years and was completely gone by the 1960s. In 2011 Eagle Scout Brent Moffat with the support of Cpl. Lewis Renninger SUVCW Camp No. 1 raised funds and placed a gold colored eagle on the monument base. A dedication ceremony was held in August of 2011. By 2013 the eagle was missing. Overall the remaining concrete pedestal is in poor condition. There are 21 known Civil War veterans buried in Laurel Grove Cemetery.
