Utah and the Civil War

"The monument honors the Utah men who answered the call to protect the mail and telegraph lines along the continental route during the Civil War. April 25, 1862 acting governor of Utah, Frank Fuller called for volunteers from the Nauvoo legion. The next day twenty-four men under Col. Robert T. Burton left for their assignment. Two days later Brigham Young received an authorization from President Abraham Lincoln, through secretary of war Stanton, for a company of cavalry to serve ninty days protecting the same route. One hundred and six men responded for duty under Captain Lot Smith. Later some Utah men joined the 3rd Regiment California Volunteers stationed at Fort Douglas. Oct, 1862 - July 1866. Other pioneers served in the civil war before coming to Utah."

The Daughters raised money for the monument by selling books about Utah's contributions to the Civil War. The monument was described at being 8 ft tall, and the wings "2 foot by 3 foot". Mrs. Kate B. Carter, President of the Society presented the monument to the State of Utah which was accepted by Secretary of State F. Toronto.
