All previously painted surfaces of the monument need to have existing paint removed. After surface preparation, the face of all previously coated stone needs to be patched and repaired. Following repairs, surfaces must be given two coatings of elastomeric exterior coating. All existing stone joints must have existing sealant removed and replaced with a polyurethane rubber sealant, tooled to a neat, watertight condition. Cracks in the limestone surface of the monument must be repaired with injection grout. Horizontal joints on the monument need to be cleaned of all dirt and debris and resealed. Deteriorated or fractured stone must be removed and replaced.

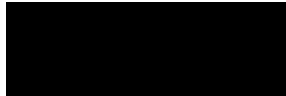

Dear Mr. Pierson,

The Winfield community acknowledges the significance of war memorials and the need to honor Union service members. Memorial Park is one of the City's largest public spaces, bringing citizens and out of town visitors together to pay their respects. Currently, the monument in Memorial Park needs significant repairs. The City has included restorations to Memorial Park in its 2020 Master Plan, but the costs of the monument repairs are significant, and completing the project will require additional funding.

The City of Winfield and the newly formed SUVCW, Pvt. John N. Eckes Camp #10 of Cowley County, Kansas asks your committee and the SUVCW Civil War Monument Fund to consider the monument in Memorial Park for a restoration grant. I have enclosed our application, the original building plans, and photos for review. Please let me know if you require supplemental information or have questions for the Camp or City.
