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**Description** The GAR (Grand Army of the Republic)Monument in Linden Grove Cemetery is an object that resembles a coffin and is nearly three feet tall and three feet wide by ten feet in length. It has been painted white and it rests in the center of a circular concrete slab. The face of the monument has two small plaques located one above the other. The higher one reads: "Erected 1929 by O.P. Sine of Garfield Post No. 2 GAR -- James Fisher -- Commander;" the lower, "In Memory of Our Departed Comrades." In the concrete below the plaques an inscription reads: "Com. Darnell Co. M 28 US Inf."

Statement of Significance The GAR (Grand Army of the Republic) Monument meets National Register criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This monument was erected in 1929 by the Garfield Post No. 2 of the GAR in Covington. It is the only monument in the state that was erected by the GAR. It is one of only seven monuments to Union troops in Kentucky. Northern Kentucky was heavily Union during the Civil War so it is not a surprise that this monument was placed in the cemetery. What is unusual is that it was erected so late. 1929 was well past the heyday of the GAR and monument construction. It is a good example of the property type "other." There are no other Civil War monuments in the Commonwealth with a design that is similar.

Verbal Boundary Description - The GAR (Grand Army of the Republic) Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of 15 feet centered on the monument located in Linden Grove Cemetery, Covington, Kentucky.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.


