



Description The Union Monument at the Perryville Battlefield state Historic Site is a simple granite obelisk. This monument is 18 feet tall and has inscriptions on the north and south sides of the base. The South side reads: "To the valiant soldiers of the Army of the United States, who bravely and heroically fell in the Battle of Perryville October 8, 1862. This monument in grateful memory of their loyal service and noble sacrifice, has been erected by the reunited republic they died to save. Authorized by Act of Congress approved March 3, 1928." The north side reads: "For freedoms battle, once bequeathed by bleeding sire to son, though baffled oft, is ever won."

Statement of Significance The Union Monument at the Perryville State Historic Site meets National Register Criterion A and is significant within the context of "Civil War Monuments in Kentucky, 1861-1935." This is one of only seven Union Monuments in Kentucky and one of two monuments at the Perryville Battlefield erected through an Act of Congress. It is significant because it is a Civil War monument in Kentucky that was built before 1935 has not been severely altered and has not been moved. See registration requirements, pp. F-2 and pp. F-3 of the Multiple Property Documentation Form.

Verbal Boundary Description - The Union Monument whose boundaries form a circle with a radius of ten feet centered on the monument located at the Perryville Battlefield State Historic Site.

Verbal Boundary Justification - The area associated with the monument is restricted to the ground on which the monument sits and a small buffer around it. The setting outside such a restricted area is not seen as critically important to maintaining an integrity of association. Because the focus of the multiple property submissions is the significance of the monuments, their proposed area of listing will reflect that they have been considered by-and-large, in isolation from their surrounds.

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
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

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
