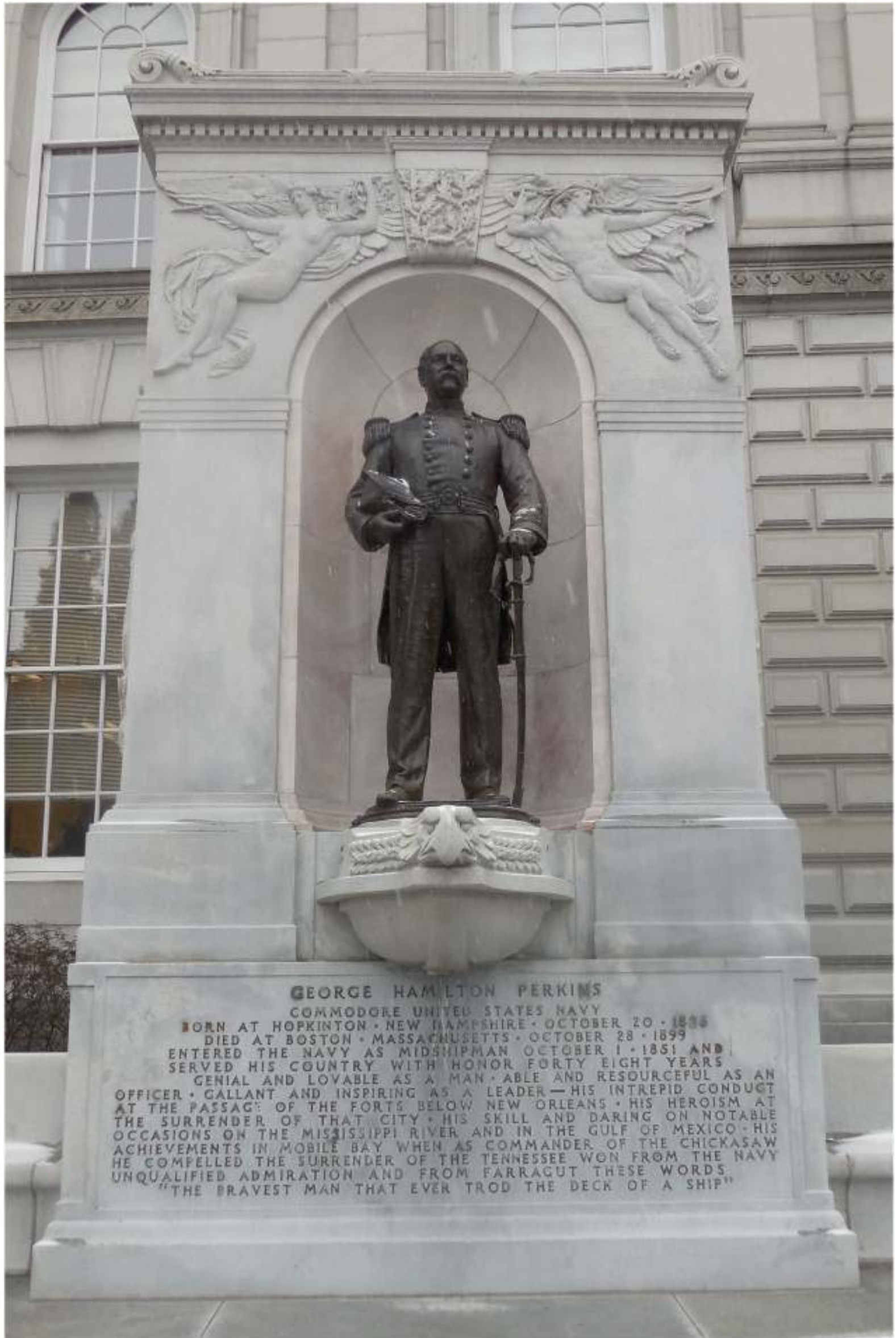

COMMODORE UNITED STATES NAVY
