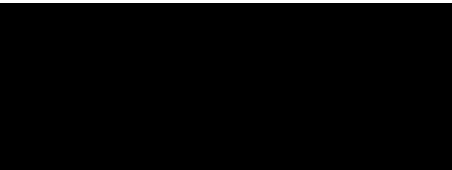

Dear Brother Shillington,

Enclosed is a Form CWM #61 describing 4 stained glass windows. These windows do not fit the standard definition of a monument so I had to improvise on the form. Our camp, together with the local chapters of the LGAR and DUV raised funds to purchase the windows from the Indianola Community Church of Indianola, WA where they were to be replaced. We are in the process of restoring them and are still looking for a final location where they will take up permanent residence. Two locations under consideration are the meeting room at the GAR cemetery in Snohomish Washington and the Veterans Memorial Museum in Chehalis Washington. The meeting room at the Snohomish cemetery is used on a regular basis by the Washington Civil War Association (umbrella organization for reenactors) and our SUVCW camp.

The windows were commissioned in 1902 for the First United Methodist Church in Bremerton Washington by GAR Post 110 and The Department of Washington Ladies of the GAR.

The camp is submitting a request for a grant from the SUVCW Memorial/Monument Grant Fund to help defray the cost of restoration.
