

Note the extreme water and cracking damage on the base.






The dedication marker is very readable but shows obvious signs of weathering.




North side




West side with obvious damage



Top showing the drain, but the spout mechanism has been removed. People seem to think this is for trash disposal. A large metal bowl inserted with water restored to feed it from the bottom, planted with flowers would be beautiful and a lovely complement to the other flowering containers in the downtown area.

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To the convention host city, the Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War present a drinking fountain, and this year Spokane is the recipient. The fountain has been placed in front of the postoffice building, with dedication ceremonies planned for 4 o'clock this afternoon, The tablet on the marble base bears this inscription: "Dedicated to the memory of our fathers of the Grand Army of the Republic, 1861-1865, by Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Department of Washington and Alaska. Lizbeth Turner Tent. Barbara Frietchie Tent. Spokane, June 21, 1933."
