The sculpture stands on a granite base (3 foot) which sits on a 2 tiered concrete base. The sculpture is of a soldier as if walking as he holds his rifle pointed at about 40 degrees down to his left. It is a form as if a person were walking a field pheasant hunting. He is in step in a walking formation with the left foot overhanging the base by the toes of his left foot. The ramrod is bent downwards from the muzzle. He is equipped with his bayonet, ammo box, and haversack bag. The sculpture stands at 6 foot tall and is hollow. He wears a kepi hat and wears a sack coat.

The monument is on the high ground in the Hillsboro Cemetery and is surrounded by his comrades.
