Reward offered for aid in finding stolen cannon

A reward will be paid for information about a Civil War cannon stolen from Union Cemetery about a week before Memorial Day.

"Or we'll pay a reward for return of the cannon." said manager Frank Dobesh, who reported the theft to police Saturday.

Dobesh estimated the cannon weighs between 500 and 600 pounds. It was welded to a steel foundation and bolted on top of the Grand Army of the Republic plaque, he said.

"I was sick all weekend about this. I understand the cannon was located on Chester Avenue many years ago and horsemen used to tie their mounts to it." Dobesh told The Californian.

"Later, the GAR brought the cannon to the cemetery." he said
