
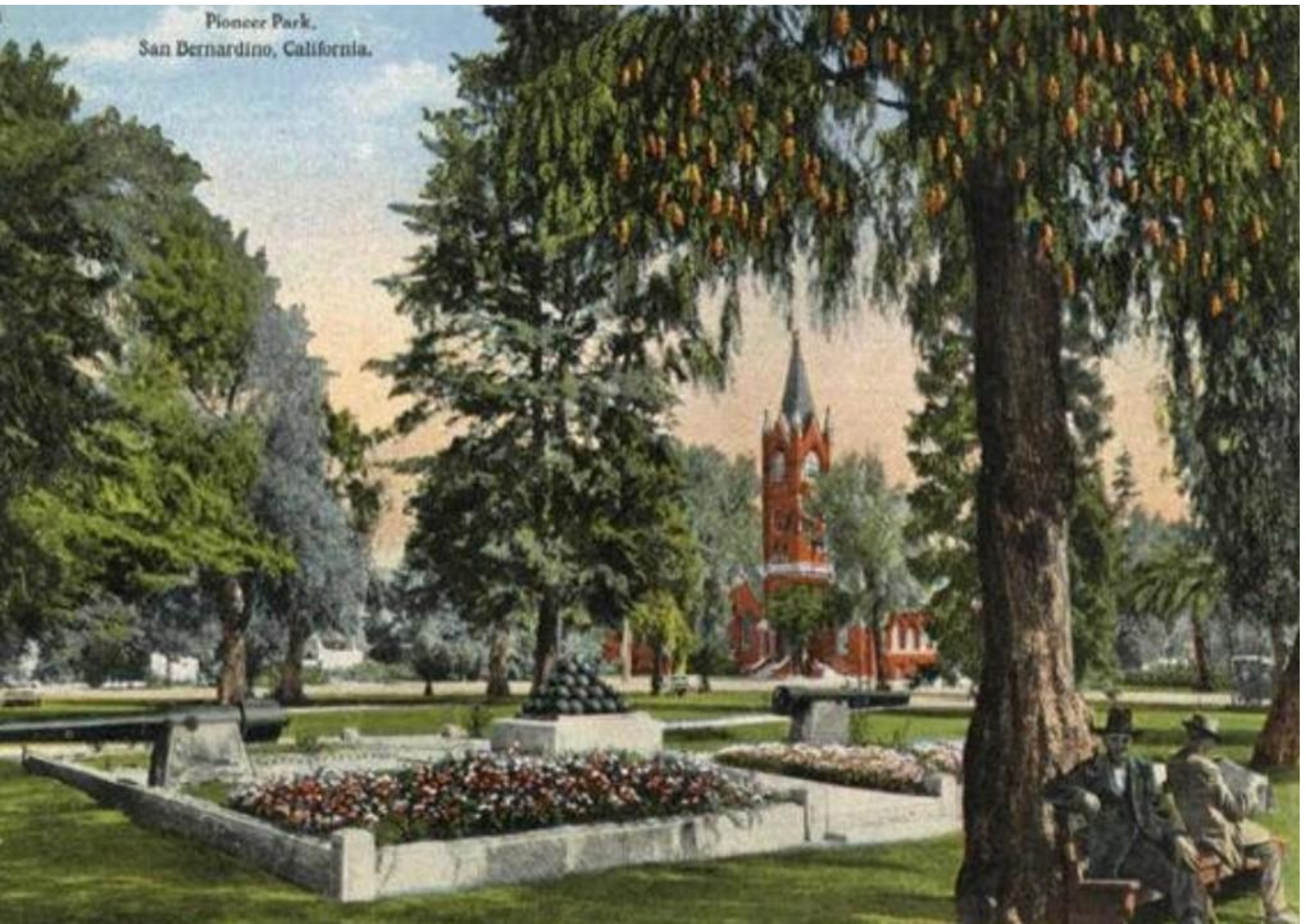

Notes: From the City of San Bernardino Parks website: "The 'Soldiers and Sailors Monument' in Pioneer Park at 6th and 'E' Streets was erected by a group of men who made up some of the last survivors from the Civil War. It was dedicated in April 1916, on the anniversary of General Robert E. Lee's surrender at Appomattox. The figure of a Civil War soldier stands atop the marble monument and on each of its four sides is a memorial to the soldiers and sailors who lost their lives in four different wars: the Revolutionary War, the Civil War, the Spanish American War and the Mexican War of 1847 when California became a part of the United States."

Dedication Preparations

Sister Godfrey reported that the Women's Relief Corps had appointed a committee to join with the Pioneer committee in preparing for the basket picnic next Saturday, which will begin at 11 o'clock, so to conclude in time to go to Fourth street in front of the Elks' hall to join the parade at 1:30 p. m, which will march to **Pioneer park** when the exercises of dedication of the G. A. R. monument will begin at 2 o'clock in accordance with the following official and courteous invitation from the Grand Army of the Republic, which was cheerfully and promptly accepted:

Headquarters W. R. Cornman Post No. 57 Dept. of California and Nevada, G. A. R., San Bernardino, California, April 3, 1916.

"Comrade John Brown, Jr., secretary California Pioneers, City.

"Dear Comrade—The Post requests the attendance of the Pioneers at the dedication of the Soldiers' and Sailors' monument at **Pioneer park** on April 15, 1916.

"The parade will form in front of the Elks' hall at 1 p. m., and the Pioneers will be assigned a place next after the Woman's Relief Corps. The dedication will be at 2 p. m.
