The Mott Monument is in good condition, and is in a good secure location. There is erosion shown on the surface of the monument due to exposure to the elements for over a century. The inscription below the names are mostly illegible, but the names are clear. The monument is now underneath the overhang of a building, which should significantly slow any further erosion due to the elements.

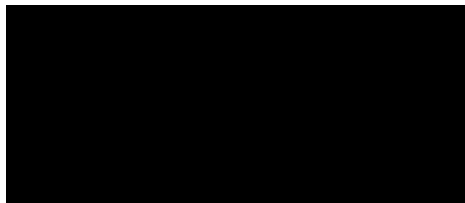

Dandridge B. P. Mott

A member of Company H 119 N.Y. Infantry fell on the field of battle at Pine Mountain, Ga. June 16, 1864 aged 17 years 2 months & 24 days, having fought bravely in defense of his country in the following battles Viz: Chancellorsville, Gettysburgh, Bridge Port, Lookout Valley, and Mountain Dugout Gap, and the series of battles from Snake Gap to Pine Mountain under the commands of the brave Howard and Hooker.

Joseph Mott

A member of Company H, 4th Heavy Artillery, N.Y.V died in the rebel prison at Salisbury N.C. October 1864 age 19 years 6 months, having served his country faithfully for two years in the war against the great rebellion. He was in the following battles Viz: Wilderness, Spottsylvania, North Anna, Cold Harbor, Sheldon's Farm, front of Petersburg June 18 and July 30, and Deep Bottom. At the battle of Ream's Station Aug. 19, 1864 he was taken prisoner and died as above from exposure and starvation.
