We, the Sons of Union Veterans, Department of New York, owe a debt of undying gratitude to our forefathers, the members of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR).

On November 12, 1881, the GAR established the Sons of Union Veterans, their descendant order. Their hope was that this order would carry on the work that they began. The work of providing support, care and education of soldiers, orphans and widows. Further, to dedicate themselves to perpetuating the memory of those who sacrificed their youth, their health and their lives for the preservation of the Union, our great nation.

Our largest accomplishment to date, was realized on August 20, 1954, when Public Law 605 of the 83rd Congress, Second Session incorporated the Sons of Union Veterans as the only organization to represent the GAR.

This dedication to patriotism and the moral, social and political needs of our country is as strong today as it was in 1866 when the first GAR post was formed in New York State.


Today, on the 125th Anniversary, we still observe General Order #11 assigning Memorial Day, May 30th, for decorating graves of soldiers of all wars. We find through the pages of this book, that many GAR posts in New York erected monuments to honor their comrades.

Through these monuments, the memory of the GAR lives on. It is our hope that this book will perpetuate that memory.

Today we are dedicated to seeking out and marking the graves of Civil War Veterans, to participate in the proper observance of holidays (especially Memorial Day) to maintain and care for their monuments and encourage, in all ways possible, teaching of American History in our schools.

We are proud to give this book to history so that others may understand and learn more through their monuments than we can teach them. The efforts of the GAR are still the finest memorial to the 359,000 Union Soldiers that gave the Supreme Sacrifice in the Civil War.

To our forefathers we say, "Thank You". We strive to obey your rituals, to maintain your monuments, resting places and preserve your memory. As the Sons of Union Veterans are preserved by the grace of God, we too will live on in the annals of time.

Message from the Commander-in-Chief of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War

The Department of New York of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and in particular Department Commander Danny L. Wheeler, Jerry & Lorraine Orton and the brothers of the various camps are to be commended for their outstanding effort to honor the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic on the occasion of the 125th anniversary of the founding of the G.A.R. in New York. As descendants of soldiers, sailors, and marines who served in the Army and Navy of the United States of America during the War of the Rebellion of 1861 to 1865, the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War is dedicated to the perpetuation of the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic and of the men who fought to defend the unity and indivisibility of our Republic. This undertaking by the brothers of the New York Department responds directly to the purpose and objects of our order. In years past, a grateful nation erected monuments to those who fought, shed their blood, and gave their lives to preserve our Union. With the passage of time, many of these monuments have suffered the ravages of the elements, been forgotten, or otherwise obscured. This book by the New York Department will preserve and document the history of these monuments honoring the G.A.R. and all those who served the Union cause.

In the year following the founding of the G.A.R. by Dr. B.F. Stephenson on April 6, 1866 at Decatur, Illinois, G.A.R. posts were established in other states including the State of New York. Of the 2,675,000 men who served in the Union forces, 408,489 of them were members of the G.A.R. when it reached its zenith in 1890. Although founded simply as a "brotherhood of former soldiers", the G.A.R. later became a strong force in American politics, education, charitable endeavors, veterans affairs, the social sphere, and all realms of the nation's life. It is quite appropriate that the New York Department of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War should choose as its project the publication of this volume on G.A.R. monuments in the State of New York. I have been told that the reason for the erection of so many elaborate monuments at New York units on Gettysburg Battlefield is because many of the veterans from New York later became successful in New York business and industry and had the wherewithal to erect such monuments. If this is true, many of the monuments depicted in this publication may be attributed to the same benefactors:

It should be noted here, that the last survivor of the G.A.R., Albert Woolson, was born in Antwerp, New York on February 11, 1847. With Woolson's death on August 2, 1956, the G.A.R. died also. Although deciding not to open membership in the G.A.R. to hereditary members, the G.A.R. had earlier designated the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War as its successor. Thus, the ideals and traditions of the G.A.R. have been carried on by the Sons of Union Veterans and its Auxiliary. The memory of the G.A.R. is not dead and will never die as long as the SUVCW has dedicated members, such as those in the New York Department who have worked so diligently to produce this publication. Brothers of the New York Department, I salute you for your valuable contribution to the perpetuation of the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic.





The four red years that followed, the sacrifice of a million lives, the horrors of deadly conflict, have been written on the pages of history, and stamped indelibly into the hearts of the men who bore the brunt of battle.

127 years ago the men whose names we bear, were the flower of the youth of the land, and with hearts aflame with the fires of patriotism and love of country, they sprang to the defense of the Union and saved a Nation.

Now is the Time to join a camp of the Sons of Veterans.

For your pride in his service for the Nation do so;

For the love of a reunited country, do so;

For the love of the mother who gave her boy to the Union, do so;

For the sentiment of Memorial Day, do so;

From your own sense of duty, do so;

Be a Son of Union Veteran, 365 days in the year.

Principles and Objects

Founded upon a trust in Almighty God, with a realization that under His beneficent guidance, the free institutions of our land, consecrated by the service and blood of our forefathers, have been preserved, and upon a true allegiance to the government of the United States of America, pledging fidelity to law and order, this Association declares its objects to be:

First —To perpetuate the memory and sacrifices of our forefathers and their services for the assistance of the Union.

Second —The inculcate patriotism, to teach truthful history, and to spread and sustain the doctrine of equal rights, universal liberty and justice to all.

Third—To assist the members of the "Grand Army of the Republic" and all honorable discharged Union Soldiers, Sailors and Marines of the War of 1861 - 1865, to honor the memories of the heroic dead, through historical exercises and the proper observance of Memorial Day.

Fourth —To aid and assist worthy and needy members of our order.


Eligibility to Membership

All male decedents, whether through the paternal or maternal line, not less than fourteen years of age, of Soldiers, Sailors or Marines, who were regularly mustered and served honorably in, or who were honorably discharged from the Army or Navy of the United States during the War of the Rebellion of 1861 -1865, and who have never been convicted of any infamous or heinous crime, or who has, or whose ancestors, through whom membership is claimed, have never voluntarily borne arms against the government of the United States of America.






Looking down into the circular crypt within, one sees the pair of sarcophagi that hold the remains of Ulysses S. Grant (1822-1885) and his wife Julia Dent Grant (1826-1902). Made of Wisconsin Red Granite, each sarcophagus weighs eight and a half tons. After twelve years in a nearby temporary vault, Ulysses S. Grant's remains were transferred to the sarcophagus on the left just before the dedication of the building in 1897. Mrs Grant's wish to lie beside her husband in death was fulfilled after her passing in 1902.






