

The cast zinc soldier has suffered from vandalism by being knocked off his base, landing on his head and being damaged as seen in photo documentation supplied by Jeff French.

There is a vertical crack on the knuckles of the proper left hand, a crack at the proper left wrist and the loss of the trigger guard. The soldier also suffers from a rearward lean which is a typical deterioration of this particular style soldier statue.

The cracks should be filled by welding in new zinc and finishing the weld to match the surrounding area. The rearward lean should be fixed by removing the feet of the statue from the base, straightening the base, and adding height to the rear heel of the rearward boot to lift the figure forward as well as can be accomplished.

PROPOSED TREATMENT

We shall come to Watertown North Cemetery and pick up the soldier with the assistance of a crane provided by local volunteers. We shall repair cracks in the hand and wrist area. We shall fabricate a new trigger guard from zinc and attach it to the rifle. We shall remove the self base from the feet, straighten the self base and make heel lifts out of zinc plate to install on the figure's heels to straighten the figure to a more upright position. The dent on the coat flap may not be able to be repaired, but we shall attempt it if the possibility looks like we may achieve a good result.

We shall air-abrasive clean the surface of the zinc to provide a fresh, uniform surface that will weather quickly to an even gray color which will hide the evidence of the new repairs.

I'm posting files into the new monument database right now and am adding the info you just sent out on this form 62 request. The monument needs to be repaired! However, the SUVCW Camp involved has submitted a form 62 on the town's main soldiers & sailors monument in 2011 (and were granted money) and we have yet to receive a Form 61 on that monument.

I have no problem with their grant and checking the web it seems there are some companies that will do zinc repair, but we need to start somehow enforcing the "No Form 61, no money" position of the SUVCW. Back in 2011 there should have been a form submitted with the 62 as the monument had existed for over 100 years. I think that is the case here also. The monument exists, submit a Form 61.
