he Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, John T. Crawford Camp #43, with the support of the Indiana County Tourist

Approximately 2,800 Indiana County veterans sacrificed and put their lives on hold so that our Union could be preserved. In the process, the abolition of slavery occurred – a grand undertaking by anyone's standards. This undertaking makes our current memorial project seem much less arduous; however, the project still requires a concerted effort from the parties involved. We need any Civic minded citizens who have ever longed to be a part of making history in a tangible manner to support this project. As the 150th Anniversary of the Civil War approaches, the timeliness of this project is paramount.

Soon he built his own foundry and pursued his dream. His sculptures of animals portray the balance of nature contrasting with man's frequent inability to achieve similar harmony. John's native American sculptures portray a search for spiritual communion with a more natural world. John's Civil War statue leaves one free to ponder what it means to see the horror of war between brothers and believe in humankind.

As the 150th Anniversary of the Civil War approaches, a committee has been formed including members of the Sons of Union veterans of the Civil War (Camp #43), with the support of the Indiana County Tourist Bureau, and the Historical and Genealogical Society of Indiana County, for the purpose of constructing a memorial. 

(About the Memorial)

Reasons for a Civil War Memorial

- Why now? 150th Anniversary is approaching. There is no Civil War memorial commemorating the Veterans of Indiana County at the County seat.
- Current deficiency of memorial has created a lack of educational value and awareness.
- This will be only one statue unlike prominent Civil War locations that have many statues.
- One statue will comprise the feelings of approximately 2800 soldiers who served in the Civil War from Indiana County.

Location

- Clark House front lawn (Historical and Genealogical Society of Indiana County)
- Former GAR Meeting House Post 28
- Mistorical center of the county
- Prominent intersection
- Statue would be within walking distance of schools for educational awareness.
- Three-way interaction with history and tourism

(Visitors to the statue will go to the Historical Society and those who visit the Historical Society will see the statue. This will bolster tourism to see statue.)

Pose


- "Rest on Arms" Ceremonial pose

Positioning

- North facing (toward homeland of Union soldiers)
 - If parallel with the building (Clark House), the statue would be NE facing.





Base

- **Barnstone** Base
- At least one-half of most Civil War soldiers came from a farming background.
- The base is a symbol of: 1.) From humble beginnings to achieving greatness
 - 2.) Progression of life Man's ascension upward
- Loose fieldstones at base: 34 stones represent the 24 townships and 10 boroughs (information derived from 1871 F.W. Beers & Co. map)
- 16 grave markers placed around the base symbolize the 15 Pennsylvania regiments partially comprised of Indiana County residents. One marker to symbolize U.S. Colored Troops from Indiana County serving in all U.S. regiments.
- Granite inset with "Rest on Arms" engraved.

Message Board at the Base

"Although his musket has long been silenced, this Civil War soldier stands as a vigilant beacon of faith ever mindful of Indiana County's approximately 2800 soldiers that were sent to preserve the Union."




