A Gift to the Post.

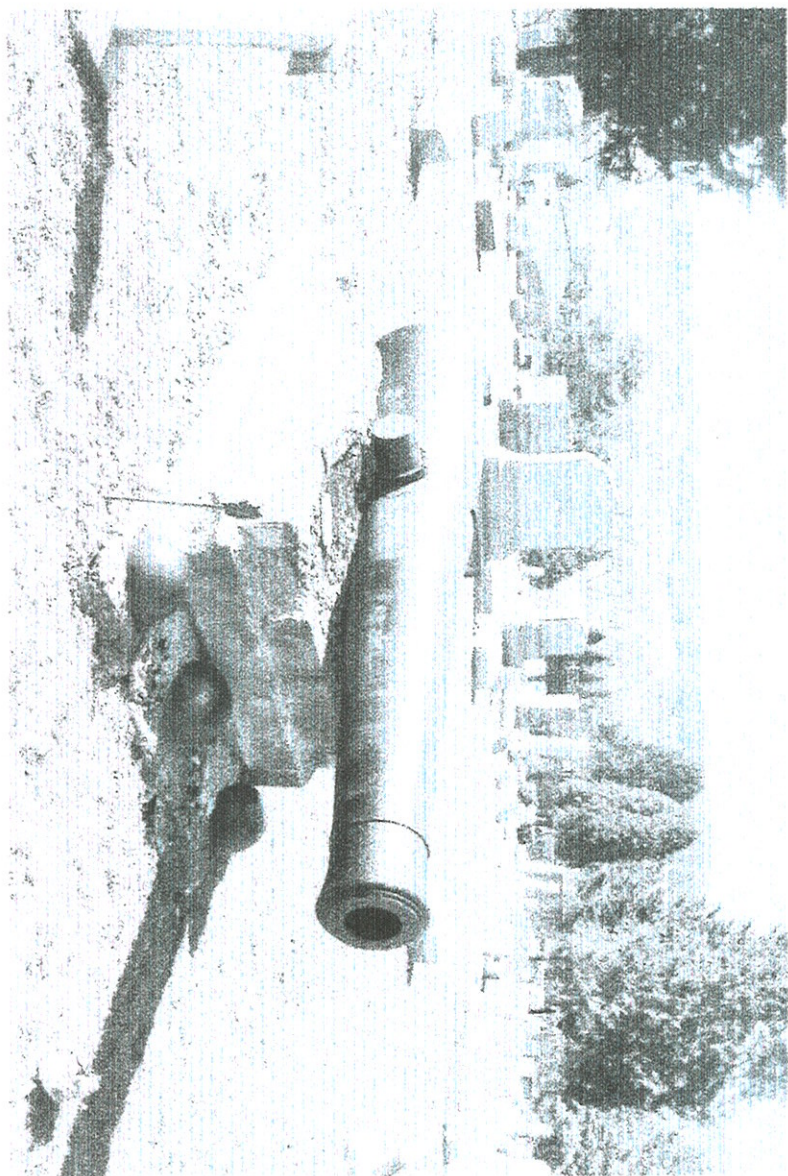
Post 28, G. A. R., of this place, will receive a substantial gift from the navy within a few days. A recent act of Congress provides for the distribution among the different G. A. R. Posts of the country of all old cannon that have been condemned by the navy, and through the influence of Congressman Huff and ex-Senator Reed, of this place, the Post here has secured four of the old pieces of artillery and 50 cannon balls. They have already been shipped from the Boston navy yards and are expected here within a few days. The Post will place two of the cannon in their lot in Greenwood cemetery while the other two will be placed in front of the Court House. Each cannon weighs 1,251 pounds.

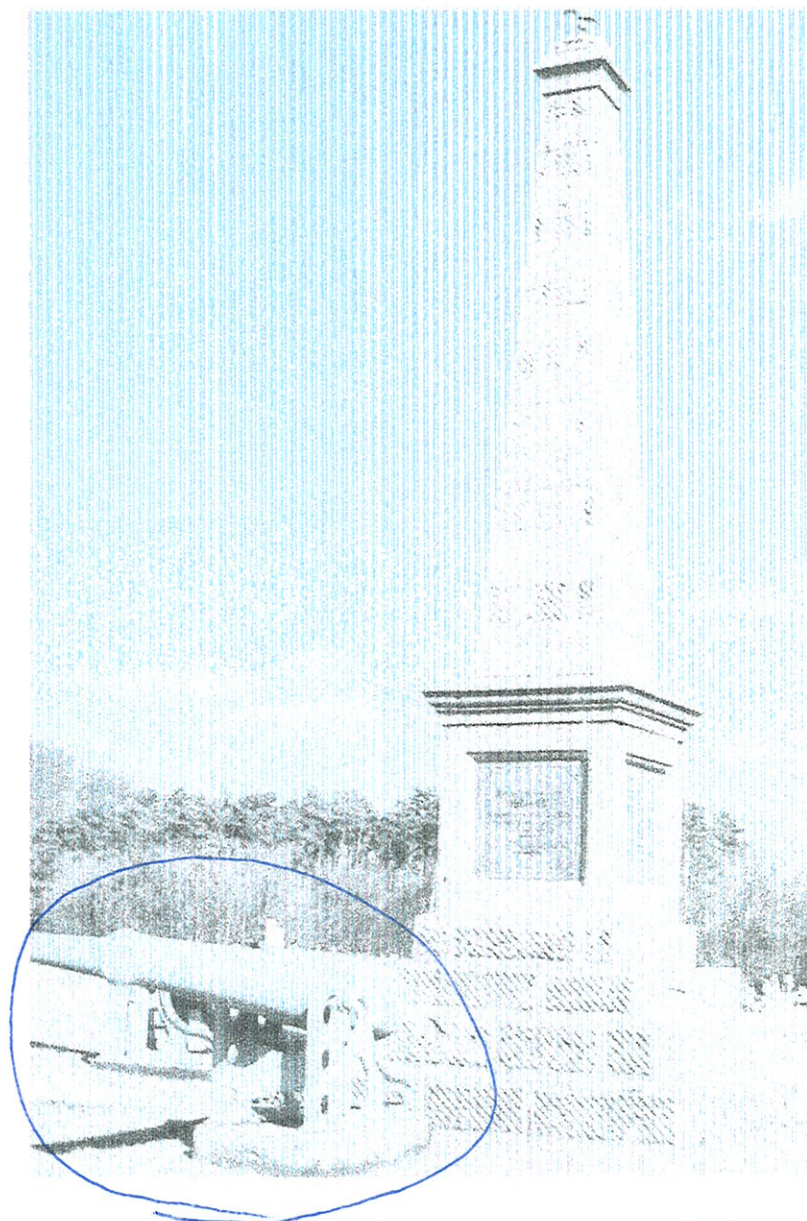
