Civil War Graves Given New Look

The Civil War Veterans monument and 47 headstones in the Civil War Veterans section of Braddock Cemetery in North Braddock have been refurbished.

Credit for the new look goes to cemetery superintendent Joseph Ragan, who obtained and re-installed the headstones at his own expense.

Many inscriptions on the headstones were barely legible, having withstood the elements over the years.

Braddock Cemetery Renovates Civil War Veterans Section



This is a view of the Civil War Veterans Section and Monument at Braddock Cemetery, Locust Street, North Braddock, following a recent overall refurbishment of the area by Joseph Ragan, Superintendent.

According to Mr. Ragan, who takes pride in honoring the memory of deceased veterans, the headstones marking 47 graves of Civil War veterans had withstood for many years the battering of rain, snow, sleet, wind and heat to a point of deterioration. Most, if not all, of the inscriptions on the stones were actually worn off.

In cooperation with the Allegheny County Dept. of Veteran Affairs, Mr. Ragan obtained and reinstalled at his own expense forty seven flat bronze Federal grave markers. In addition to beautifying the grave sites, Supt. Ragan personally undertool the task of washing down with chemicals the towering monu ment on the Civil War plot.

Those who have visited and seen the renovated monument and the grave area are proud of Mr. Ragan's efforts and his sincerinterest in honoring the war dead.
