Blairsville Parrott Cannons

Non-Rifled, Stamped with Naval Emblem

They are believed to have been placed about 1895 by the original bandstand on Market Street at Liberty Street. Daughters of the American Revolution organized the cannons' delivery to Blairsville. They sat three decades in the center of town and were moved in the 1930s from the town square to the cemetery

No one from Blairsville Borough, the Blairsville Cemetery Association or the Historical Society of the Blairsville Area claimed or identified anyone in charge of the guns. So the VFW moved forward. Keith Fabrication did the repair work at no cost to VFW.

The cannons were cleaned up, mounts repaired and all replaced by 11-7-2021



clamp on the left trunion on the west cannon has one inch crack in it. Again, the wall monument is for the VFW and
American Legion. It is not G.A.R. or SUVCW. The cannons were loaned to the G.A.R. by the U.S. Navy.



A couple of the big guns will likely be placed in the public square and two in the cemeteries. The Post at this place received four condemned guns last summer and two of them were placed in the court house yard and two in Greenwood cemetery. The freight and the cost of setting them up amounted to nearly \$200.








Row of old stone houses, band stand and McKinley Monument in area formerly



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The old bandstand at "The the inter- section of W. Market and Liberty streets, is shown in a winter photo between the Civil War and World War I. The two Civil War cannons were removed in the 1930's and placed at the old community swim- ming pool along the Conemaugh River near what was then Morewood and avenues. During the 1940's, the cannons were moved to the Blairs- ville Cemetery Veterans Circle where they stand in 1975 as reminders of a bygone era. The bandstand was torn down in the 1930's and the Diamond area included a street light, flag pole and some flowers until 1969 when the West Blairsville Urban Renew- al project was started. Then the Diamond was re- constructed to a normal intersection without the "is- land" in the middle. Graff's store shows in the background. This store was located in the old Ex- change Tavern. The stable building where the horses were kept is to the right. The last regular tenant of the old Exchange Tavern was Elmer Sal- sgeber's Market St. Garage. When the old structure was demolished, Mr. Salsgeber started a new ga- rage along Route 22 near ffe Route 22 east and west exit and entry ramps to the busy highway. This business continues under the name of Market Street Garage.
