





Selectman Michael Kelleher was dismayed to learn the ABCC upheld White Hen Pantry's appeal. He noted he has been against granting the convenience store a beer and wine package store license from the very start and even sent the ABCC a letter to express his opposition to the idea.

# The story behind the statue

Civil War Memorial is 'something special'

When it comes to Civil War memorials, Saugus can claim bragging rights for owning a first-rate monument crafted by one of the most distinguished local sculptors of the 19th century.

The 30-foot-tall Civil War memorial located at the Saugus Center Rotary was the creation of Melzar Hunt Mosman, a former soldier in the Civil War renowned for casting bronze figures for monuments after the hostilities subsided between the North and

Kevin Tucker, a Wakefield resident who serves as the national Civil War memorials officer for the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, dug up this nugget after viewing a

Tucker explained Mosman's considerable skill is evident in the attention to detail he displays. The Saugus Civil War Memorial consists of a tall granite monument topped with an allegorical female figure that is meant to represent the United States.

This female wears a helmet with an eagle on the top and holds a shield in her right hand. Below bronze figures of a sailor and Mosman is most well known solider, with reliefs of laurel for casting a variety of pieces for wreaths adorning the base of each

The 30-foot-high Civil War Memorial is the featured centerpiece of the Saugus Center rotary. It was crafted by Melzar Hunt Mosman, a Civil War veteran who made a name for himself after the war ended by casting bronze monuments across the country.

#### A fitting tribute

According to the Smithsonian American Art Museum sculpture database, the Saugus Civil War memorial was erected in 1875. The names of 160 men who fought in the war appear on plaques located on the sides and back of the base.

The memorial was the gift of Henry E. Hone of North Saugus, and granite structure.
