**History:** The Woman's Relief Corps coordinated the efforts of raising the funds by hosting  $10\phi$  suppers. The Cedar Springs Clipper assisted "the good sisters in their noble work" by appealing to the community to raise the balance needed by asking citizens to donate \$1.00. In June of 1906, they raised the \$275.00 needed for the 14 foot tall monument.

The monument was cleaned on November 7, 2001, by a group of citizens in Cedar Springs. On November 11, 2001, a rededication ceremony was conducted by the Allied Orders, American Legion and MOLLUS (SUVCW Gen John A. Logan Camp No.1, Michigan Commandery of MOLLUS, WRC Champlin Corps No. 41, American Legion Glen Hill Post #287 & DUVCW Eva Gray Tent No. 2)
