Dearborn, 1962

Washtenaw County (Cont.)

Statue by Mary Ann Starkweather. They died to make their country free. Committee: Florence S. Babbitt, President; Adella C. Snidecor, Secretary; Cornelia B. Savey, Treasurer. Erected in 1885 by the Woman's Relief Corps of Ypsilanti in memory of the men who fought in the war of the Great Rebellion to uphold their Country's flag. Memorial Day 1895.

Boulder with bronze tablet, City Hall Lawn, 304 North Huron St., four blocks north of West Michigan Ave., Ypsilanti. Inscription:

Ypsilanti, Michigan, 1921, in loving memory of Carpenter Post No. 130, Grand Army of the Republic. Dedicated by the Carpenter's Woman's Relief Corps No. 65; Carpenter's Camp No. 180 Sons of Veterans; Martha A. Beach Tent No. 5, Daughters of Union Veterans.

WAYNE COUNTY

Bronze tablet on U. S. Grant House, Michigan State Fairgrounds, Detroit. The house was originally located at 1369 East Fort Street, Detroit, where the plaque was dedicated Nov. 3, 1922, under the auspices of the Art Commission. Inscription:

Upon this house occupied by him as his home in the year 1849 the City of Detroit has placed this tablet commemorating Ulysses S. Grant, then Lieutenant, later General, United States Army and for two terms President of the U.S. of A. Savior of his country.

Bronze tablet on same building as above. Inscription:

This one-time residence of Ulysses Simpson Grant presented to the State of Michigan as a modest monument to a great man by the Michigan Mutual Liability Company 1930.

Equestrian statue of General Alpheus S. Williams at Central and Inselruhe avenues, Belle Isle, Detroit. The statue is the work of Henry Merwin Shrady. It depicts Williams sitting astride his horse studying a battle map during a storm. The bronze statue is mounted on a block of white granite. The statue was unveiled on October 15, 1921. Inscription:

Major General Alpheus Starkey Williams -- 1810-1878 -- Hero of two wars -- Judge -- Editor -- Postmaster -- Diplomat -- Member of Congress -- an untiring servant of the people -- an honor to the City of Detroit. The Michigan Commandery of the Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States and Citizens of Detroit have erected this tribute to the valor and abilities of Alpheus S. Williams, Lieut.-Colonel First Michigan Infantry Volunteers in the Nar with Mexico. Brig.-General and Brevet-Major-General United States Volunteers in the Civil War.
