R., the sixty odd riflemen of the city and the many of veterans, the navy veterans and the local companies of the state militia assembled at Memorial hall, when the two 24-pound Howitzers, donated to Memorial hall by the secretary of war, were formally dedicated and turned over to the country Saturday afternoon. The ceremony of the gun dedication was held inside the building. There was a number of American flags to decorate the stage of the auditorium.

It was a large and enthusiastic audience which gathered at the dedication ceremonies. The general artillery of the state militia assisted in the dedication of the guns. A beautiful program, including a band, followed the dedication. A number of veterans, including the late Gen. Sherman, were present.

### IMPORTERS DEFEND CASE FROM CAPITAL

#### FACE TRIAL

#### On the Charge of Defrauding the Government, Under the Whip of Collector Loeb.

NEW YORK, Oct. 21.—Prosecution of one of the largest importers in New York, charged with defrauding the government by means of underpayments, in those days when the Sugar Trust was consolidated and import brokers' interests were low under indictment, are imputed, according to "Market Week," to the late Mr. Loeb returned from a conference in New York with the attorney general of the Treasury Franklin MacVeigh, late Attorney General George W.ickersham.

The only name of the importers whose identity is clearly pointed, in their offering payment of duties, was not clearly stated in the monetary procedure prescribed by law.
