

# LAST VETER IN OF

M. A. Garrett Passed Away At Home Near Belfast Wednesday, Aged 98 Years

M. A. Garrett, Highland county's oldest citizen and the county's last surviving Civil War veteran, died at his home near Belfast early Wednesday morning. Funeral services will be held Friday morning at Prospect church with burial in Prospect cemetery.

Mr. Garrett was born on a farm on the Pigeon Roost road, a few safles east of Hillsboro; and had lived in Highland county all of his long and useful life. He had been engaged in farming all of his life and until a few months ago managed his large farm, riding over the farm on horse back.

When a youth of only 17 years, Mr. Garrett enlisted in the Union Army. He saw his comrades passes because He always attended to Day service and in respectively.

A few years after he was discharged from the army he married and moved to the farm on which he died and he and his wife had the unusual privilege of living together happily for 66 years, Mar Garrett dying in 1934.
