

Sherman House Lancaster, Ohio

Birthplace of
Civil War General William Tecumseh Sherman
and
Senator John Sherman
author of the Anti-Trust Act, Secretary of the Treasury and
State

The Sherman House in Lancaster, Ohio has been owned and operated by the Fairfield Heritage Association since 1982. This early frame house is preserved, together with its later, brick front section, as a Registered National Landmark commemorating the two Sherman brothers, William Tecumseh and John, who were born in this house.

The original 1811 section of the house affectionately known as "The Little Brown House on the Hill" contains the restored dining room, master bedroom and children's bedroom. The home was known as the center of hospitality in Lancaster, hosting such notables as Henry Clay and Daniel Webster.

The 1816 section contains
Judge Charles Sherman's
study and the Sherman family
parlor. On the second floor, is
a re-creation of General
Sherman's field tent with
Civil War exhibits and a
room of Sherman family
memorabilia which features
the family album quilt.

The Little Brown House on the Hill

The front Victorian section of the house with its brick exterior, not associated with the Sherman occupancy which ended in 1844, is furnished as a Victorian reception room.
