Son of Union Veterans of the Civil War Civil War Memorial/Monument Fund

The purpose of the Memorial/Monument Grant Fund is to assist Camps and Departments in their efforts to refurbish and restore Civil War related memorials and monuments. The grant fund is open to the preservation and restoration of Civil War monuments and memorials as well as supporting the production of new monuments. Priority of funds will be for preservation. Requests for new monuments will be accepted between 1 May and 15 June. The committee is authorized to revisit and issue remaining money, of that year, to camps and/or departments who have submitted requests for that year on a need basis.

Note: All requests submitted after 15 June shall be considered for Grant Awards, but shall not be paid until after the National Encampment. The National Treasurer is not allowed to make Grant Award payments after a fiscal year ends on 30 June each year; however, Grant Applications may still be received by the Committee during this period, but shall be placed on hold for a period until after the Encampment.

The following provides some general guidelines as to how to apply for a grant and how grant submittals will be evaluated.

1. Any SUVCW Camp or Department may request money from this fund.
2. The more information provided the better the chances of getting approval.
3. All requests will be handled individually on its own merit.
4. Only one request from one entity (Camp or Department) can be accepted per monument or memorial.
5. Standard procedure is to send funds to the vendor.
6. The maximum grant shall be \$2,000 per project. However, funds remaining at the end of the year may be disbursed to grant recipients or to National Park Service, Department of Defense, and/or Department of Veterans Affairs for the preservation of Civil War monuments.
7. Provide pictures and copies of all documentation as to appraisals, estimates, etc.

NOTE: The fund will only pay for work to be done, not for appraisals, estimates, surveys, etc., since they are considered to be a requirement of the application and help to describe the work to be done.

8. The review committee will consist of three of the elected Council of Administration members.
9. Requests for funds and submission of this form does not guarantee award of funds.
10. If a grant is ultimately awarded, photographs and/or images taken before and after refurbishment will be required for documentation purposes and possible placement on the SUVCW website.

The Short Military Career and Long Life Marion Barrett

Marion Barrett was born June 16, 1840 the second child of William H. and Eliza Betz Barrett. His grandfather was Arthur Barrett, who arrived in Harrison County from Virginia and filed a claim for 960 acres on the forks of Brushy Creek in 1803. His grandmother was Mary Huff, the daughter of early Ohio tracker and Indian fighter William Huff.

Marion, a farmer by trade, enlisted with the 98th Regiment of the Ohio Volunteer Infantry when it was formed in August of 1862. He was enlisted by A. P. Lacey on August 9th in Cadiz and reported at Steubenville on the 22nd. He fought in his one and only battle at Perryville, Kentucky, on October 8, 1862. He was shot in the ankle and had his haversack blown from his back. He went through this relatively well and afterwards participated in other Regimental activities. In November he contracted diphtheria and was hospitalized. While recuperating he was captured by troops commanded by Confederate General John H. Morgan sometime late in 1862.

He was listed as "absent, sick," on the November and December regimental reports and as "absent, at Camp Chase, Columbus, Ohio, paroled (sic)

prisoner" on the January report. His parole document was signed by Lieutenant Green, CSA, and endorsed as correct by General Pfeifer, 57th Reg OVI, surgeon in charge of the hospital at Columbia, Kentucky. His granddaughter, Yvonne Busby, was told he was so sick Morgan decided not take him after capturing the hospital. He was exchanged January 1, 1863, and sent to the hospital at Camp Chase in Columbus. By this time, his diphtheria had developed into a chronic debilitating bronchitis. Added to this, he contracted measles in February, 1863. He was discharged for disability on April 23, 1863. His father, William, traveled to Columbus to accompany him home. Because of Marion's debilitated state, William was unable to recognize his own son.

Barrett eventually recuperated and became a successful farmer, owning farms in Harrison County and Missouri. He was very active in the G.A.R. He went to the last reunion at Gettysburg and is pictured, along with other veterans, in the lobby of the National Museum at Gettysburg. He attended a reunion in Columbus, Ohio, when he was 100 years old. At some point he was reported missing by the reunion organizers. The Harrison County sheriff was contacted and visited the family home to break the news of the old veteran's disappearance. Barrett never knew he was missing; the reunion bored him and he took the bus home early. Upon arriving in Cadiz he decided to visit his niece.



All the while oblivious to the excitement his departure had caused.

He died at the age of 104 on October 14, 1944. Harrison County's last Civil War veteran. It is interesting to think that when Morgan came through Harrison County in July of 1863, he passed within two miles of one of his former prisoners.

We would gladly feed and clothe the soldier boys at half-price, were it necessary and we were allowed to do so, but the powers above us have decreed that we must feed and clothe the slacker, loafer, professors and 8 hour classmen of the cities at the same price we receive for providing nourishment for the boy who fights beneath the flag of his country.

Be it so. We are moved to ask, what have the wool growers east of the Mississippi River done that they are given so representation in the commandeering of their product? They produced nearly all the varieties and grades of wool grown in the country, yet, are so completely ignored and shown as little courtesy as though they were alien enemies. If, they were an organized labor clan, seeking to exact plunder as the price of duty, they would doubtless be accorded representation on every board that deals with their product.

Reverting to our first request, relative to the application of common sense to the handling of this season's wool clip, we respectfully ask for immediate attention and will expect to receive it. We want fair treatment and a just government will grant it, for when the government takes the property of the citizen, it is morally bound to see that he whose property is taken is fairly treated. We asked no more.
