Albert and James Lyon Camp 266 Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War Minutes of April 6, 2019 Meeting

The meeting was held at the Dominic Jacobetti Home for Veterans in Marquette, Michigan.

Members Present: James Decremer, Joe Durbin, David Hensley, Dewey Jones, Pat Kennedy, Paul Nelson, Joe Osbrn, and LeRoy Wyatt. Brothers Phil Parks, James Strain, and Gary White were excused.

Prospective Member Present: Jim Duflo.

The meeting was called to order by Commander Kennedy at 1:05 p.m., followed by a prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

The Minutes of the December 1, 2018 meeting, which were printed in the January 11, 2019 Newsletter, were approved. The February 2, 2019 muster had been cancelled because of dangerous driving conditions.

Brother Paul Nelson reported that he had spoken with Brothers Phil Parks and Gary White yesterday. Both were in good spirits and thanked us for our prayers and telephone calls. It was also reported that Jeanne Rose had moved to the following address: 501 S. Lincoln Road, Apt. 210, Escanaba, MI 49829. Messages can be left for her at the Lakeview Cemetery in Escanaba.

Brother Paul Nelson reported that he had been unable to contact Brother Jerry Gerughty for over one year. Because of his contributions to the camp over the years, the camp voted to approve an Honorable Discharge for him.

The All Veterans Museum which is being build on the Upper Peninsula Fair Grounds in Escanaba was discussed. The camp discussed placing items on load in the Museum. It is important to note that items should be placed in the museum on loan with written certification so that the items can be recovered when needed. The Museum is also looking for donations.

Brother Joe Durbin will represent Camp 266 on the Museum's Board. Brother Nelson indicated that he would send biographical material developed by the late Brother Richard Rupley on Houghton County Civil War veterans to Brother Durbin for the Museum.

Brother Nelson reported on the revised camp Bylaws. The significant changes were to reduce the quorum for a meeting to four members and to add language in several places recommended by the Department to insure our tax-exempt status. The camp voted to approve the revised Bylaws. Brother Nelson will send the approved Bylaws to the Department for review.

Because the new Bylaws indicate that the property of the camp will be turned over to the Department in the event that the camp dissolves, the camp voted to state that the only property

The camp voted to have Brother Paul Nelson order 12 aluminum GAR grave markers and have them sent to Jim Decremer, 10300 Main Street, Rapid River, MI 49878.

The camp voted to send a check for \$100 the Member Assistance Fund at the Jacobetti Home for Veterans.

Prospective member James Henry Duflo was initiated into the camp to honor his Great Great Grandfather, Peter Duflo who served in Company M of the 1st Michigan Engineers&Mechanics from 1863 to 1866 with the rank of Private.

Brother Decremer displayed his Burnside carbine and its cone shaped cartridge. This weapon was the third most used rifle by Union cavalry after the Sharps and the Spencer rifles. It was 54 caliber and used 70 grains of powder. It was manufactured by General Burnside, and later by Bristol Firearms between 1857 and 1865. He also passed around an original GAR medal.

The camp voted to add a Report on Patriotic Activities to the agenda for all future meetings to help the Patriotic Instructor prepare a report for the Department.

The camp has asked the Department to schedule its next encampment in the Upper Peninsula.

The next Camp 266 muster will be on Memorial Day at Rapid River. There will be a display at the Lion's Club.

The camp thanked Brother Dewey Jones for the newspaper publicity. It has been producing good contacts.

The meeting closed with a prayer at 2:35 p.m.
