VFW, American Legion take lead on statue restoration project

The Veteran's Memorial Day Statue celebrates its one-hundred and tenth anniversary this year. Along the base and steps, visible cracks have emerged over the decades. Photo provided FLUSHING – The wear and tear of time has finally caught up with the Veterans Memorial Statue in the Flushing City Cemetery, which has stood as tribute to fallen soldiers of the Civil War since 1906.

Flushing American Legion Post #283 have united with the Flushing VFW, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War and veterans of the Flushing community behind a restoration plan for the monument to ensure its long-held spot for generations to come. In order to fund the project, they need the help of the people.

Preliminary estimates total between

\$10,000 and \$20,000 to repair significant cracks in concrete around the base and stairs of the statue. John Howe, commander of the Flushing Legion Post, said he is uncertain the statue could last through another winter without further damage being done.

For this reason, a fundraising target day has been set for September 11, before the heavy snow begins to fall. If all the money is raised by this time, the repair work should be finished no later than November 11 (Veterans Day).

A local Boy Scout troop has already raised funds from the community, and small donations and assistance from church and community service groups are encouraged to aid in the effort.

Individuals and groups can send donations to the Flushing Veterans Memorial Restoration Fund at P.O. box 125, Flushing, MI 48433-0125. Further inquiries can be directed to John Howe at the American Legion.

The Veteran's Memorial Statue, a depiction of a soldier from the Civil War, is itself made of granite. It is to commemorate all the wars pre-1906, while the memorial plaques surrounding it acknowledge all of the United States wars in the following decades.

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


