

History:

According to the Watson Post records, the G.A.R. post members placed a cast iron urn to hold flowers in 1898. This Memorial Urn stands sentinel over the original 1861 US Soldier burial ground in Grand Rapids.

Over the years it became neglected, corroded and nearly forgotten until a renewed interest at the turn of this century rescued the urn from certain oblivion. In 2000, it was cleaned and painted but it was vandalized and broken beyond repair. It was replaced completely in 2008.
