Famous But Forgotten

Perhaps, this was being a little too enthusiastic about Alexander Macomb's permanency of fame. He was a prominent soldier in the war of 1812, but it is probable that the average local citizen is not cognizant of that fact today. In 1914, the monument on the southwest corner was rededicated to Col, John Stockton and the 118th Michigan Volunteer cavalry. It is probable that the two cannon will remain in their present position for many years to come. In the event that Gratiot is wid-

ened in front-of the square, it is probable that the two guns will be moved back.
