



Michigan Civil War Centennial Observance Commission

Dearborn, 1962

Livingston County (Cont.)

1861-1865. In memory of John Gilluly Post No. 114 and Woman's Relief Corps No. 22. Erected June 10, 1925.

Boulder with bronze plate, on U. S. 16, front lawn of Carnegie Library, Howell. Inscription:

Erected by Waddell Woman's Relief Corps. In memory of and dedicated to Waddell Post No. 120 G. A. R. and all veterans of Livingston County, who served in the War of '61-'65. "They Fought to save us a Nation."

Monument to the soldiers of the Civil War, Lake View Cemetery, Howell.

MACKINAC COUNTY

Bronze plaque at Fort Mackinac, Mackinac Island. Inscription:

In Memory of General Thomas Williams, Commandant of Fort Mackinac, 1852-1856, Killed in Battle, August 5, 1862.

MACOMB COUNTY

Memorial in the cemetery at New Haven, near where Civil War dead are buried. Inscription:



Erected 1901 in memory of our fallen heroes of 1861-1865. Erected by the John Stockton Woman's Relief Corps, Dept. of Michigan. -- Soldiers --

Monument with a life-size statue of a soldier, in cemetery on M-19, at north village limits of Richmond. Inscription:



They did such deeds. Erected by the Henry G. Beebe Woman's Relief Corps in memory of our Union soldiers, 1861-1865. Dedicated Oct. 20, 1894.

MECOSTA COUNTY

Monument supporting statue of a Civil War soldier, on Courthouse lawn, Elm St., three blocks east of U. S. 131, Big Rapids. Erected in 1893. Inscription:

1861-1865 in memory of the men who in the War of the Great Rebellion fought to uphold their country's flag. They died to make their country free. Erected by the women of Mecosta County.

MENOMINEE COUNTY

Red granite monument with bronze tablet, Memorial Park, Sheridan Road, Menominee. Inscription:
