PRE-PAID INTERMENTS

For those wishing to complete as many arrangements as possible before needed, we offer a trust fund for the prepayment of grave opening and closing charges. The charges can be paid for in-ground interments as well as Columbarium entombments.

INTERMENTS

Interments are made on Monday through Saturday. There is an additional charge for Saturday, Holiday or after 4:00 P.M. burials. Burials are made during the winter months on Tuesday and Thursday only. There is no extra charge for winter burials.

Questions can be answered by calling the Cemetery Office. An effort will be made to answer any question in a timely manner.

Information can be obtained from the office regarding genealogy research.

We take pride in the work that we do. We provide a place of solitude to remember loved ones that have gone before, a place of meditation, of connecting with our ancestors. We are thankful to the residents

of the City and two Townships that for over a century have taken pride in this important part of the community.

FACTS

Greenwood Cemetery consists of approximately 90+ acres with 70+ acres mowed and trimmed. There are over 15,000 burials with 10,000+ markers mowed and trimmed around along with shrubbery, trees and flower beds.

There are almost 1,000 veterans from the Civil War to Vietnam --- each with his or her own flag during the summer months.

We have over a thousand trees including maples, birch, beech, ash, spruce, white pine, flowering crabs, plums and pears. There are many differing varieties of shrubs as well.


The staff consists of three full-time positions. The employees maintain the grounds and buildings along with making over 100 burials per year. They also maintain the following 'utilities':

18,000 feet of water line 3.5 miles of paved roads

3 miles of gravel roads

1.5 miles of chain link fence

HISTORY

Greenwood Cemetery is located in Petoskey, Michigan overlooking Little Traverse Bay. It is a Perpetual Care Municipal Cemetery serving the City of Petoskey, Bear Creek Township and Resort Township. We also serve many surrounding communities for those who wish to make the serenity of Greenwood their final resting place.

The Cemetery was first utilized in the mid-1860's and was incorporated by an act of the State Legislature in 1897.

Greenwood is comprised of 90+ acres of mowed and wooded area. We share the grounds with whitetail deer, turkey, rabbits and squirrels.

CEMETERY LOTS

When the time comes to choose a cemetery lot, we have differing areas to choose from. There are sections with family lots and sections where a single or double grave space may be purchased. There are views of the Bay or of farmland.

The North Section of family lots has sixgrave lots available. There is a nice selection offering differing views and proximity to woods. The South Section allows for a choice of a single grave space or as many spaces as you would desire. There is a nice variety of newly planted trees and paved roads. Our newest sections have a view of the bay and offer a selection of two or four grave lots. There is a choice of lots with upright monuments or flush markers.

In all areas of the Cemetery we allow two cremations per grave space or a combination of one cremation and one traditional in-ground burial.

COLUMBARIUM

Another choice is a Columbarium (a mausoleum for cremation entombment). A Columbarium niche includes room for two small urns, bronze lettering and floral plantings by the Cemetery. For those choosing cremation this allows a choice other than in-ground burial.

The charge for a niche includes the inscription of one or two names and Perpetual Care. The only other charge would be for the entombment of the cremains at the time of death.

We feel it is important to entomb cremations rather than scatter because a loss of heritage occurs when there is no record of the final resting place. As one source of genealogy research we know that it is im-

portant to provide a 'trail' of our lives for those that follow.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

In order to maintain the beauty of the Cemetery there are rules to provide for the orderly yet personalized landscaping. We do not allow artificial flowers but do allow for planting beds of live flowers, vases of cut flowers and areas for shrubbery and trees. We allow monuments and markers in most sections for individualization of memorialization. We also have areas for flush markers for those that desire the simple yet unobstructed appearance. A copy of the rules is available at the Cemetery office.

SERVICES

We offer other services to the public to make the choice of a Cemetery and its services as easy as possible.

INSTALLMENT PLAN

We allow lots to be purchased over a period of two years. There is no interest rate or fee charged for this option. Should the contract not be finalized, the payments made will be returned less the charge for non-completion.
