Mr. Croll representing the Alpena Stone & Marble Co., was in town Tuesday and was awarded the contract for building the monument.

# 1 May 1913

Supervisors' Proceedings....

Afternoon Session.

Board called to order by Chairman Buck.

The following communication was received:

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors, Roscommon County, Michigan. Gentleman, We the undersigned in behalf of the Soldiers and Sailors of Roscommon County who fought the battles of 1861 to 1865, do most respectfully ask your honorable body to make an approbation or \$500 for the purpose of erecting a monument to their memory.

All of which is most respectfully submitted for your consideration.

1 May 1913

Friday Morning, April 18, 1913...

To the Honorable Board of Supervisors, Roscommon County:

Gentlemen Your committee on finance and appropriation to whom was referred the communication of F. L. Robbins and H. H. Woodruff relative to an appropriation for a monument to the Soldiers and Sailors of Roscommon County, would respectfully report that we have had the same under consideration and recommend the sum of \$250 be appropriated out of the general fund of the county for the erection of such monument and the same be erected in the Higgins Township Cemetery.

We would also recommend that the purchasing of such monument and the erection of the same monument be placed in the hands of F. L. Robbins and H. H. Woodruff, upon whose certificate of purchase of material or completion of the work, the chairman and clerk of this board be instructed to draw order or orders in payment of same.

# 8 May 1913

Memorial Day will be observed in a very fitting manner this year if nothing happens to interfere with present plans. Aside from, the usual program of music, initiations, speeches, etc., the old soldiers hope to unveil the new monument which is soon, to be erected in the court yard in honor of the old soldiers and sailors who fought in the battles of '61 to'65.

# 29 May 1913

Charles McLean of Alpena representing the Alpena Marble and Granite Co., was here this week erected the new monument has been erected in the Court yard and presents a very neat appearance. The unveiling services will be held tomorrow afternoon.

# 5 Jun 1913

Roscommon did honor last Friday to the soldiers and sailors of the nation. Ideal weather prevailed and one of the largest crowds ever assembled to a similar occasion turned out to pay their respects to the old comrades. At one o'clock the old soldiers, school children and a large representation of citizens gathered at the band hall, where one of the most imposing Memorial day parades was formed. Headed by the Roscommon City Band they marched through the main streets to the court house lawn where an excellent program was rendered. John Carter of St. Helen was the speaker of the afternoon, and to say the least, his address was impressive and enjoyed by all.
