[text continued] Steelville, it used one from the rich Cherry Valley Mines. Mining drew German and Austro-Hungarian settlers. The St. Louis, Salem & Little Rock R.R.
(Frisco) reached from Cuba to Steelville and south through the county, 1873. Cuba was laid out in 1857; Leasburg had its first house in 1859; Bourbon, in 1863. Cherryville, Huzzah,
Dillard, Berryman, Davisville, Cooks Sta., Wesco are other communities. part of the county lies in Clark National Forest
The county with its Meramec River and big springs, has many pre-historic Indian sites. Near Leasburg are Cathedral and Onondaga caves. Old mills standing are Oak Hill,
Westover, and Dillard. In Steelville for a time lived J.J. Upchurch, founder Ancient Order of United Workmen in PA., 1868.
