## Fort Sand Springs marker dedication a memorable event

Springfield resident Cate Schnoebelen and Marshfield resident Colton Clifton attended the April 24 dedication of the Fort Sand Springs historical marker. The two are sixth cousins.

The dedication on Saturday, April 24, of a new Civil War marker commemorating Fort Sand Springs, located in Webster County on the southeast corner of Highway 38 and Timber Ridge Road, proved to be a memorable experience for the crowd who packed the Timber Ridge Baptist Church. Over 100 spectators, including many descendants of the men whose names appear on the marker, were in attendance. The descendants were honored with certificates.

Special guests from the area included Lyndall Fraker, Northern Webster County District commissioner; Jerry Hartman, manager of administrative services, Sho-Me Power; Bob Kenworthy, Timber Ridge Baptist Church; Linda Blazer, director of the Webster County Historical Society; Roger Herman, Frontier Theater; Marilyn Smith, Fair Grove Historical Society; Ted Hillmer, superintendent, and Jeff Patrick, librarian, Wilson's Creek National Battlefield; Roseann Blunt, Wilson's Creek National Battlefield Foundation; John Rutherford, past department commander of Missouri and past commander, Phelps Camp No. 66, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War (who presented an interesting history of the fort); Terry Cadenback, commander, 4th Missouri Volunteer Cavalry, and Jackie Warfel, Vera Chandler and Rose Jones, Greene County Historic Sites Board.

The marker was placed recently by the Mary Whitney Phelps Tent No. 22, Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War, 1861-1865. A number of members attended the dedication, many attired in Civil War-era clothing.

#### FORT SAND SPRINGS

Site located .6 miles due East, bounded by Timber Ridge Church Road, Battlefield Road and Sand Springs Road.

DURING THE CIVIL WAR (1861 - 1864). A STOCKADE AND FORTIFICATION WAS ESTABLISHED AT SAND SPRINGS, MISSOURI. A TOWN WHICH WAS NAMED FOR THE CLEAR WATER BUBBLING UP THROUGH THE SAND. IT WAS ALSO A CAMPING PLACE FOR WAGON CARAVANS TRAVELING THE WIRE ROAD FROM ST. LOUIS. THE FORT WAS BUILT OF HEAVY OAK BOARDS DRIVEN INTO THE GROUND. IT WAS MANNED BY THE 74TH REGIMENT ENROLLED MISSOURI MILITIA (AND A UNIT FROM ILLINOIS) THROUGHOUT THE WAR. IT WAS AN IMPORTANT FEDERAL "SATELLITE" OUTPOST AND LOCALLY - RECRUITED UNITS USED IT AS A BASE OF OPERATIONS FOR UNION FORAYS INTO THE REGION.

CONFEDERATE GENERAL JOHN S. MARMADUKE'S EXPEDITION INTO MISSOURI RESULTED IN A SKIRMISH AND THE BURNING OF THIS FEDERAL FORT AT SAND SPRINGS UNDER THE COMMAND OF CAPTAIN JAMES C. HERD. CONFEDERATE COLONEL JOSEPH O. SHELBY'S FORCE MOVED EAST WITH A BRIGADE ON THE ROLLA ROAD FROM SPRINGFIELD ON FRIDAY JANUARY 9, 1863, AND ENTERED THE TOWN ABOUT 7:00 P.M. THEY APPROPRIATED "EVERYTHING WHICH COULD BE FOUND" THEN CAMPED FOR THE NIGHT. HIS ESCORT AND LIEUTENANT F.M. SCOTT THEN "FIRED" (BURNED) THE FEDERAL FORT, SCATTERING THE SMALL UNION FORCE. COLONEL SHELBY THEN JOINED FORCES, NEAR MARSHFIELD, WITH COLONEL J.C. PORTER AND COLONEL EMMETT MACDONALD AND "PUSHED" ON TO HARTVILLE, MISSOURI.
