# FORT DETTE

Former site of Ft. Dette, a blockhouse for artillery with infantry defense built by the Union Army during the Civil War. Begun in mid-1863 and abandoned in August, 1865, this fortification guarded the northern approaches to Rolla and the army shops and warehouses along the railroad tracks. The fort was named for Capt. John F. W. Dette (pronounced "Detty"), a St. Louis architect and engineering officer who supervised its construction.
