

SONS OF UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR National Civil War Memorials Committee



This organization was founded at Decatur, Ill., on April 6, 1866, by Union Army Veterans of the Civil War. The principal objects were to promote a feeling of fraternal friendship among the veterans of federal naval and military forces in the Civil War, to perpetuate the memory and history of the dead, and to extend aid and comfort to the orphans and widows. Annual encampments in the leading cities and meeting of state and territorial departments became a feature. Among the achievements of the organization were the adoption of Memorial Day and the passage of much special pension legislation. The membership was at its peak in 1890, with over 400,000, but there has been a constant decrease owing to the annual deaths. In 1923 the membership was reported at 84,578; in 1933, 10,138; in 1940, 500. And at the time of the last encampment in 1949 there were only six remaining members.
