Civil War Skirmish – 1862 West Plains, Missouri

THE ONLY CONFRONTATION BETWEEN UNION AND CONFEDERATE REGULARS IN HOWELL COUNTY OCCURRED AT THIS SITE ON FEBRUARY 19,1862.

COMBINED FORCES OF COLONEL WOOD'S SIXTH MISSOURI AND MAJOR DRAKE'S THIRD IOWA CAVALRIES, SEEKING TO LOCATE AND ENGAGE CONFEDERATE COLONEL COLEMAN, SURROUNDED THE TOWN (POPULATIONI ONE HUNDRED FIFTY) AT 3:00 P.M. AND OPENED FIRE WITH SMALL ARMS AND A MOUNTAIN HOWITZER. COLEMAN AND HIS CAVALRY WERE ABSENT, AND CONFEDERATE REISTANCE WAS ONLY BRIEF.

THE UNION FORCES SUFFERED NO CASUALTIES, SIX OF THE CONFEDERATE INFANTRY WERE KILLED, EIGHT WERE WOUNDED, AND FORTY WERE TAKEN PRISONER; SIXTY STANDS OF ARMS, FORTY HORSES, AND SEVERAL WAGONS WERE CAPTURED AS A RESULT OF THIS SKIRMISH.
