## THE BATTLE OF MOORE'S MILL

THE ON THE AFTERNOON OF JULY 28, 1862, SOME 400 RECOURT
TO GURRILLAS FROM NORTH MISSOURI LED BY COLONEL JOSEPH
MARIER C.S.A. AMBUSHED 730 UNION TROOPS UNDER COLONEL ODON
GUTAR OF THE NINTH MISSOURI CAVALRY. AFTER SEVERAL HOUR:
THE FURTHER FLOHTING, THE CONFEDERATES WERE FORCED BY SUPERIOR
FERFOWER TO RETREAT NORTHWARD ALONG AUXVASSE CREEK LEAVING
THE DEAR AND NORE THAN LOO WOUNDED. UNION LOSSES WERE IN
RESELE AND 35 WOUNDED. THUS ACTION PREVENTED PORTER AND
THE MISSOURIERIVER TO JOIF CONFEDERATE
THE SEASOURIERISTS ARE BURIED IN.
