



The defense of New Madrid began in late October 1861 when Confederate General Meriwether "Jeff" Thompson returned from one of his many raids. Thompson, following a suggestion from his superiors, constructed a small earthwork in a cornfield just south of town. Brigadier General Gideon Pillow selected Colonel Edward W. Gantt's 12th Arkansas Infantry Regiment and sent them down river from Columbus, KY to New Madrid. Gantt's command consisted of the 11th Arkansas, 12th Arkansas, Upton's Company of Heavy Artillery and Stewart's Company of Heavy Artillery for a total of about 1,000 infantry and 120 artillerymen.

NEW MADRID

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On December 7, 1861 Governor Claiborne F.

Jackson, the Rebel governor of Missouri, came to New Madrid. The combination of Jackson's arrival and the establishment of a regular garrison called for a celebration. Colonel Gantt's regiment and Jeff Thompson's command both paraded in front of Governor Jackson and his staff while ladies and gentlemen from town cheered and applauded the military show. Then Governor Jackson delivered a speech dedicating the new fort and naming it Fort Thompson, after its builder.

Fort Thompson, (the original location was washed away by the ever-changing Mississippi River), was a four-sided, bastioned work of five-foot thick reinforced walls built by piling sacks of shelled corn and then covering them with dirt, surrounded by a ditch created by removing the dirt for the walls and was constructed by the labor of about 500 slaves. Thompson's men packed the dirt down by holding horse races upon the fort's walls. Upright planks protected the entrance that faced south toward the river. Eventually the fort would mount fourteen heavy guns, which would
