The 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) adopted "Old Abe", The Wisconsin War Eagle, as its mascot upon the division's activation in August 194
Since World War II these soldiers, nich named the "Screaming Eagles", are recognized worldwide for their dedication, courage and valor
