A red granite (approximately 1 1/2 feet square) marker was placed near the south rifle-pit at the
100th anniversary celebration of the battle in 1964 by the Iron County Civil War Centennial Committee
It was placed where it was thought to be in line with the south rifle-pit. Later research suggests it is off by several
feet and that the Sons of Confederate Veterans marker more truly depicts the rifle pit location.
