BATTLE OF PILOT KNOB RUSSELLVILLE JUNCTION SEPTEMBER 26, 1864 1 P.M. - 2:30 P.M.

Text:

Slemons' Brigade, riding in advance of the Rebel army, was first spotted at 1 p.m. by pickets here at the Russellville Junction. After the pickets had sounded the alarm, a cavalry patrol rode here to verify the pickets' report. Despite much shooting there were no casualties on either side. This phase of the conflict ended at 2:30 p.m. when the Union cavalry fled, leaving the road to Ironton open to the Confederate advance.2
