Last Soldier Edward Streepy Private Edward Streepy (1844-1942) was the last living soldier of Appanoose County. He served in Company I, 36th Iowa Infantry Regiment from August, 1862 until August, 1865. He was captured at Marks's Mills, Arkansas on April 25, 1864 and remained a prisoner until released to his Regiment on February 25, 1865. Thanks to Danny Krock for placing a Last Soldier marker on 7/19/19 and providing the photo. Private Streepy is buried in Eaton Cemetery located east of Unionville off 450th Street.
