US Model 1839 12-Pound Field Howitzer (Experimental)
Howitzers were short cannons designed to throw exploding shells in a lobbing arc towards the enemy. The advantage of a howitzer is its large caliber and arcing trajectory— the disadvantage is its shorter range: about 1,000 yards compared to 1,500 yards for a gun. Generally, two howitzers were combined with four guns in a battery, thereby giving artillerymen flexibility in engaging the enemy under different conditions. Howitzers were used by both armies in the Battle of Wilson's Creek.


This howitzer is a prototype of the model adopted in 1841. It is a few inches shorter and a few pounds lighter than the adopted model. It was cast by N.P. Ames Foundry in Springfield, Massachusetts in 1840 and weighs 690 pounds. The howitzer is serial number 13.
