This was an area of one-story homes known as Dutchtown. Just east of here was a brick college building surrounded on three sides by a wooden stockade. This compound was being used as a prison for prisoners of war. The Union forces failed to post a garrison at this post, and it was easily taken by men of Shelby's "Iron Brigade" early in the battle. It became a fortified strong-point from which southerners fired into the Union lines until after dark, when the stockade was abandoned by the southern troops. Just to the east of the stockade, across Campbell Street, was the city cemetery where Federals, crouching behind tombstones, fired on the advancing Confederates until forced to retreat by the Confederate onslaught.
