BATTLE OF SPRINGFIELD

At this site, facing south, the 250 men of the 72nd Enrolled Missouri Militia (EMM) met the Confederates' afternoon attack. Although earlier routed from its position along Walnut Street, between Campbell and Main, by Col. Emmett McDonald's regiment, the 72nd EMM rallied along Jordan Creek under Brig. Gen. C.B Holland and Col. Henry Sheppard.

From this point the men of the 72nd fought valiantly. The afternoon fighting was house to house, behind fences, and through alleys and backyards. The 4th Missouri State Militia were forced to fall back to Fort No.2. The 72nd bore the brunt of the battle and withdrew to a new position along Jordan Creek, suffering 20% casualties during the fighting.
