

Tour Stop 11 Hinkle's Grove

At about 1 p.m., Oct. 23, 1864 Confederate Gen. Shelby. Was withdrawing slowly from his position near the Wornall house. He'd been ordered to pull back by Gen. Price because of the collapse of Marmaduke's Confederate line at Byram's Ford. Union troops under Gen. Pleasonton arrived here at that time. In the lead was Thurber's Battery of Rodman guns. They opened fire form the edge of the grove that was here. Philips' Union Brigade then arrived. Shelby retreated south and east with Union Generals Blunt and Philips in hot pursuit.
